Connect with ancestral wisdom through dreams and sacred storytelling.

With this open call, HAUT, in collaboration with Black to Normal and Jason Jacobs, are seeking 4 artists to take part in a 6-days residency-workshop.

The residency-workshop will be guided by Jason who invite the participating artists to engage with intentional dreaming, dream-writing, and sacred performance to amplify their purpose as storytellers. Inspired by Jason's performance "Kraal", and the sacred teachings of the Kharkams Veld, this residency-workshop offers artists, especially Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, time and space to honour their/our ancestors in performance creation.

As a participating artist you will be encouraged to access ancestral memories, stories, and experiences through intentional dreaming. You will translate these dreams into text and ultimately embody them.

We are seeking 4 artists to join us for this residency-workshop, which centers on the transformative power of ancestral connection and the potential for dreams to facilitate personal and collective healing through performance practices. The call is open for artists based in the Nordic countries. Participating artists must be able to speak and understand English, as the residency-workshop will be facilitated in English. Artists must apply individually.

CURATION

HAUT curates this open call in collaboration with Jason Jacobs. We seek artists with a strong performance practice, eager to engage with their experiences, interested in working both individually and collectively in a shared and facilitated space centered around ancestral memories, text and performance practices.

CO-CURATOR

Jason Jacobs (he/they) is a storyteller and traditional healer-in-training who tells stories that awaken the spirit of home, community and connection to source. He has a deep passion for creating sacred spaces where others can remember and step into their wholeness. Jacobs' one-person performance KRAAL will be presented in Copenhagen in week 42 as part of the Black to Normal festival 2025.

WHAT YOU GET

As part of the residency-workshop you are offered:

- 1 week residency-workshop in the Black Box at Thoravej 29, Kbh. NV together with three other artists and facilitator Jason Jacobs.
- A fee for 6 working days as well as participation in production- and introduction meetings, and evaluation of 8.450 DKK pr. artist.
- Cover of expenses for national/international travel costs. Maximum 3.000 DKK pr. Person. We strive to travel by train and bus only.

The application can be written/recorded in Danish or English. Speech should be clearly audible and text should be readable. Drawings, sketches, gif-images and memes can be added as a supplement to your application (max. 2 pages).
